

In order to help you prepare for the autumn exams, we've answered some of the key questions you might have below.

### **When are the autumn exams happening?**

- AS and A-level exams will start on Monday 5 October and finish on Friday 23 October.
- GCSEs will start on Monday 2 November and finish on Monday 23 November.

### **When will I get my results?**

- AS and A-level results will be out on Thursday 17 December.
- Results for GCSE Maths, GCSE English Language, Functional Skills, the AQA Certificate and Level 3 Extended Project will be out on Thursday 14 January.
- All other GCSE results will be out on Thursday 11 February.

### **What do I need to revise?**

The exam papers will be the same as they would have been in the summer if exams had gone ahead, so you'll need to prepare for all the usual elements of the papers.

There's no non-exam assessment (NEA) for the autumn exams – except for Art and Design.

### **Will we be sitting the papers we would have taken in the summer, or are they new papers?**

You'll be taking the exam papers we'd printed for the summer, so they'll all have the original May/June dates on them – but don't worry, the invigilators will be checking to make sure you've got the right papers.

### **What can I do if I'm feeling stressed?**

It's perfectly normal to feel stressed about taking exams. There's some advice on our website about [how to manage exam stress](#) and where you can get extra support if you need it.
